# **GHOST WALK 2024 IS HERE!**

The Fall season is upon us, which means our signature event – the **24th Annual Historic Ghost Walk** is just around the corner. History comes to life as local actors portray "ghosts" of real-life characters buried in Linwood Cemetery, including the infamous Doc Holliday and Kid Curry. This popular event highlights historical characters of Glenwood's past - telling the

stories of their lives and their impact on the community. The Ghost Walk occurs over three weekends in October, beginning on October 4th. Tickets sell out fast as over 750 members of the community walk the lantern-lit path to Linwood Cemetery. Guides will escort you as you walk gravestone to gravestone, hearing stories from Glenwood Springs' past. As the October evenings set in, come prepared for cooler temperatures and wear appropriate shoes for a short hike to the cemetery. Don't forget about the hot apple cider and homemade cookies waiting for you back at the bottom should you come back alive.


