MEET OUR NEW BOARD PRESIDENT AND DIRECTORS

It has been a year of big change for our Board of Directors. Since summer of 2023, we welcomed five new members to our board. We welcome their new ideas, new energy and new perspectives. Joining our long-time board members Rob Anderson, Nick Daley and Lisa Passmore are new members Tyler Benton, Diane Delaney, Kevin Gibson, Brenda Grumley and Jamie LaRue.



We are also very excited to announce that Iamie LaRue will serve as the new president of our board of directors for the coming year. Jamie is the executive director of the Garfield County Public Library District. He's been a frequent speaker on leadership, organizational development, censorship and the future of libraries. Jamie has been instrumental in guiding our efforts to catalogue and our organize museum collection. Recognizing the alignment of missions of

the Library District and local historical societies, Jamie created a pilot program placing an archivist intern, Ari Beachey, with Glenwood Historical Society to create a system to digitize, catalogue and organize the museum collection. This experimental program has been hugely successful in advancing the organization of our museum collection, as well as providing access to digitized content such as historical new papers to a larger library archives. Ari is a student at Colorado Mountain College and benefits from on-the-job training through this unique partnership.

Our board of directors began the year with the creation of a new strategic plan which will guide our programs and efforts in the coming years. We developed financial policies and procedures, new bylaws, a collection policy for the museum, and succession planning for our board and leadership. We are very happy to report we have made great progress on all of these areas of focus.



Creating financial transparency and adopting new financial policies and procedures has been a major focus of our organization in the past year. Gaining the confidence of our community by adopting strong internal controls, clear policies that will guide the preparation of our financial statements, and consistent financial reporting procedures have been first and foremost on our list of organizational goals during the past year. As a not-for-profit that relies heavily on the contribution of volunteers who generously give us their valuable time, we have incorporated accounting for the great contribution of volunteers into our financial statements. The efforts of our volunteers represent one third of the year-to-date activity of our organization.
